Brief on Appeal

- 1. Mr. Turner was denied his federal constitutional right to due process of law when the trial judge denied his motion for directed verdict of acquittal on the charge of first degree criminal sexual conduct; in the alternative, the verdict is against the great weight of the evidence.
- 2. Manifest reversible error occurred when the trial judge instructed the jury that defendant could be convicted of aiding and abetting first degree criminal sexual conduct if he did something to help the principal "at least temporarily avoid detection."
- 3. Clear reversible error occurred when the trial judge failed to instruct the jury that it must be unanimous as to a theory of the principal's guilt before it could find Mr. Turner guilty as an aider and abettor.
- 4. Mr. Turner was denied his right to a fair trial when the trial court introduced rape trauma syndrome testimony over defendant's objection, where the issue of the child victim's reaction to the assault was not injected by defendant, and where the witness testified that the victim was in fact assaulted.
- 5. Manifest reversible error occurred when the trial court admitted damaging hearsay testimony over defense objection.
- 6. Mr. Turner was denied his right to a fair trial when the trial judge gave a circular instruction on the intent required for aiding and abetting which failed to convey to the jury that the accessory must assist the principal with knowledge of the crime intended by the principal.
- 7. Mr. Turner was denied his right to a fair trial when the trial judge failed to instruct the jury that the assistance offered by defendant must have had the effect of inducing the crime.
- 8. Mr. Turner was denied his right to a fair trial when the prosecutor argued to the jury that they had a civic duty to believe the testimony of the complaining witness.
- 9. Mr. Turner should be resentenced because the trial judge abused his discretion in imposing an excessively severe sentence of 15 to 30 years imprisonment, where the guidelines range was 60 to 120 months, and where the judge relied upon a reason for departure which violated the Michigan Supreme Court's decision in $\underline{\text{In Re Dana Jenkins}}$.

Relief Requested

Defendant-Appellant respectfully requests that this Honorable Court reverse his conviction for first degree criminal sexual conduct, discharge him from the offense and remand the case for a new trial on the remaining charge for second degree criminal sexual conduct; in the alternative, Defendant requests that this Court reverse his convictions and remand this case for a new trial; in the alternative, Defendant requests that this Court remand this case for resentencing.

Narrative In your own words, please give us a detailed explanation of the events from the day of the crime until you were

charged (include additional pages if necessary). Lakeysha (a 10-yr-old girl from apt #212) peeks into our apartment window at #204, to gawk again at Janet, my transgender apartment mate. Janet is sitting at her Atari computer in the living room. As she had the night before, Lakeysha stares at Janet as "a man with lipstick," while I'm still asleep in back bedroom since I work nights. This is shortly after 3:00 p.m., the hottest part of the day. Because our A/C was not working, Janet left the front window blinds open and the front door ajar on this hot July day, as she had the night before. Annoyed by her intrusiveness, but keeping true to her Native American spirituality not to "vex children," Janet lets Lakeysha into the apartment to placate her curiosity. Lakeysha indicated to Janet she's bored. They strike up a conversation. Janet invites Lakeysha to try her computer games. Their conversation turns to clothing. Janet shows Lakeysha some of her cloths, lets Lakeysha try some on. Janet's clothes closet is just outside of my bedroom, and their conversation wakes me up about 4:00 p.m. Not wanting any strangers in our apartment, I am irritated with Janet for not first consulting me about having this unknown guest. As Janet shows Lakeysha her clothes closet, I open the bedroom door to go the fridge in the kitchen for a cool drink of water, and to see who Janet is talking with. My discomfort increases as I see this strange girl disrobe her top and try on a top Janet hands to her. I return to my bedroom and close the door, pondering what I should do. I consider calling my wife, since I have a line phone in my bedroom. I feel a need to someone to talk about this unwelcomed guest Janet has in my apartment. Instead of calling, I decide to talk to her in person since she lives a half mile down the road. And to retrieve the car we share so I can get to work that night. About 20 minutes after returning to my bedroom, I leave it again. As I step out of the bedroom I see this young girl sitting on Janet's lap at the Atari computer station in the living room. As before, neither acknowledge my presence as I pass behind them and out the front door at about 4:30 p.m. According to Janet's later statement, she shows Lakeysha her video strip poker game, but insists the game is too challenging for almost anyone to win and see the computer generated figures bare all. Still feeling irate and ignored, I leave the apartment and start walking to my estranged wife's apartment. It takes me about ten minutes to get there. But I find my wife is not home, so I walk to the local Post Office to check my mail, another ten minute walk. After checking my mail I head back to the apartment, another ten minute segment in this triangular shaped trek. Upon returning to the Oak Park apartment a half hour later, about 5:00 p.m., I find Lakeysha is gone. So I asked Janet who that was. She tersely replied, "Keysha, or something like that." Seeming upset and not ready to talk about it just then, I let it go with the expectation of bringing it up later. In the meantime, I brew a pot of tea, this time not as strong as the first attempt the night before. Janet commented how it did turn out better than yesterday's attempt. Some minutes later, shortly after 5:30 p.m., we hear a knock on the door. Janet goes to answer it and steps out onto the balcony in front of our apartment. She is confronted by a woman angrily demanding to know, "Why did you mess with my daughter? What were you doing fucking with my daughter?" 13

Janet goes down on one knee to placate her alarm, replying, "I don't know, I don't know why I did it, let me explain."
Just then I hear someone running along the balcony getting closer to our apartment. Janet then quickly leaps back into our
apartment as a tire iron is being thrust at her and barely misses her head. I quickly shut the door and lock out the assailant.
The man continues to beat our apartment door with his tire iron while the woman hysterically shouts, "Call the police,
someone call the police!"
As we stand in the living room trying to make sense of it all, I turn to Janet and say, "If she doesn't call the police, I will."
Janet nods, and I go to my phone in the back bedroom and call 911. I jot down the date and time of the call on a post-it note:
"19930707.1743" for 5:43 p.m. Later I would learn I was the third in about eight 911 calls for this incident.
Some minutes later two officers show up. One of them orders the man to drop the crowbar, which he does. One of the officer
then knocks on our door, and finally feeling safe we open and let him in.
He asks us to explain what happened. Not knowing when Janet first let this girl into the apartment and for what purpose, I
simply replied, "I don't know, I just woke up." This was long before I had any clue I was going to be implicated as well.
Janet declined to give any statement, replying, "Just take me to jail."
"Why?" the officer asked. "Because of what the girl is saying," is how Janet replied. I sensed Janet thought she was only
being accused of improperly touching the girl when helping her try on clothes, and perhaps any liabilities for having the girl
disrobe to try on her clothes. That this I think was what she was acknowledging when admitting to the mother, "I don't know
why, let me explain."
After asking if we agreed to a search of the apartment, we both declined without a search warrant. Then the officer asked
us to sit in the back of the squad car, explaining it as a precaution in case we had access to any weapons in the apartment. We
relented and were escorted to the back of the squad car.
To protect her rights, I asked Janet not to tell me anything. Janet was convinced she was going to be in jail for a while, so
while sitting in the back of the squad car she asked me to find a letter for her once I was able to return to the apartment. The
letter was in an orange folder, she explained to me, from the Institute for Psychosexual Health in Milwaukee. As I understood it,
the letter would help her access appropriate care as an incarcerated transgender person.
We could see across the parking lot the girl being interviewed by other officers in the presence of her distraught mother. I
asked the officer what the girl was saying and he replied that we must already know. Minutes later the officer told us we were
